42 Amend Phoenix City Code Chapter 4 Related to Commercial Ground Transportation Trip Fees (Ordinance G-6650)

A motion was made by Councilwoman Williams, seconded by Councilwoman Stark, that this item be adopted as amended per the following amendments to Phoenix City Code Chapter 4: 1) Increase existing and set new commercial ground transportation trip fees for non-rideshare companies and rideshare companies (known as Transportation Network Companies) as recommended by staff effective Feb. 1, 2020. The Year 1 trip fees for pick up and drop off will be GT Mode: TNC - \$4.00; Vehicles - 1-8 Seats - \$1.75; 9-23 Seats -\$2.25; 24+ Seats - \$5.00; 2) Establish a process to annually adjust trip fees in an effort to maintain a level of cost recovery. All future trip fee adjustments for both non-rideshare and rideshare companies shall increase at the greater of 3 percent or the Consumer Price Index to keep up with the cost of inflation. For non-rideshare companies, this is effective Jan. 1, 2021 and for rideshare companies this is effective Jan. 1, 2025; 3) Provide the following incentives to discount the trip fee rates: a) 10 percent for each trip made by alternative fuel-powered vehicle or 40 percent for each trip made by a zero-emissions vehicle and b) 30 percent for each trip that initiates or terminates at the 44th Street or 24th Street PHX Sky Train Stations; 4) And make conforming, clarifying and renumbering changes as necessary.
